MARCH MEETING REVIEW

The meeting began with President Linda Cox asking the Committee members to introduce themselves and give a synopsis of their areas of responsibility. U3A NP currently has 349 active members

Guest Speaker, Bill McCullum, CEO, Pacific International Hotel Management School, (PIHMS)

Bill McCullum first came to Taranaki in the early 70s and was offered a job as a charge nurse, setting up the psychiatric unit at Taranaki Base Hospital. It took him seven years to complete a comprehensive nursing degree at the Taranaki Polytechnic. He became a tutor and rose through the ranks, to become Deputy Principal at the Polytechnic.

In 1974, when PIHMS was established, Bill took up a job teaching at this campus. Bill has written the curriculum for a number of courses at PIHMS. Bill said it is hard to define education, always a process of change and learning. He emphasis the importance of students learning as apposed to teaching them. Bill focused courses on skills, knowledge and attitude. He cultivated an environment of discipline.

At the beginning of 2020 the school had 500 students. When Covid struck it took the tutors just two days to shift the courses to online learning. PIHMS is a private organization that was significantly, financially impacted by the pandemic. It's taken four years for PIHMS to gradually get back up to speed. It currently has 100 students. Bill said proof of the school's success is that many of its graduates are sort after by businesses and have gone on to become managers of hotels and restaurants in NZ and other countries around the world.

Bill McCullum is a man of vast experience. He spoke with authority and wisdom. In his eighties, Bill said he is too busy to retire.
